### Safer Internet Day 2019

Safer Internet Day 2019 was celebrated on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> February with the theme: Together for a better internet.

Online Safety is something we continually work on at Laurel Avenue; we don't just focus on its importance once a year. However, Safer Internet Day is a good opportunity to discuss how it is essential that we are safe and kind whilst using technology. Our Safer Internet Day assembly was delivered by school's Online Safety Group. The group, made up of children in Reception to Year 6, delivered a very important message, asking children to think about: 'Our Internet, Our Choice - Understanding Consent in a Digital World'.



Class 3 children wrote an instruction text for safe use of the internet, which gave thought to giving and receiving permission and consent for sharing data, information and pictures.

Class 4 discussed the issue of consenting to our data being shared online both by 'friends' and through the use of apps.

Children in Classes 2, 3 and 4 also created posters along the theme: Our Internet – Our Choice, showing their understanding about the importance of consent!

Nursery and Class 1 children created posters about choices we make online to keep us safe.

Class 2 children created guides about how to be safe online. They also acted out activities that can be done with technology, taking the opportunity to discuss safety at all times.





### Class 3 Art Project



## School Nursery

We are excited to announce that we will be opening up our Nursery provision to two year olds from Monday 25th February 2019, after the half term holidays. These sessions will be five mornings, 9:00 – 12:00. All 4 spaces have already been taken but if you would like to be added to the waiting list, please contact us - 0191 3868416, email at

The two year olds will work in a ratio of 1 adult to 4 children at all times so we are really able to concentrate on their needs as two year olds. We will echo the principles of our three and four year old provision, but taking into account fully the needs of children at the age of two. These children will be guaranteed a place in our Nursery when they turn three where their transition will be seamless having made excellent relationships with staff and their friends. We have a wonderfully caring team of teachers and teaching assistants who are experienced and trained to nurture, care for and inspire every child in their care, therefore providing the best start and education for your little ones.

We have cosy and warm areas as well as areas packed with educational resources and equipment. Our Nursery is spacious with a large private garden and access to the school yard, field and library. At the beginning of March we are having a brand new, outside play equipment structure with huge mark making boards built, and the construction of a tarmac track will follow. This will provide children with exciting opportunities to explore, have fun and learn in a safe and secure environment. We offer the opportunity for your children to be inspired and, as a result, learn and develop on a daily basis.

#### How do you apply?

If you have received a golden ticket, bring it into our school office and we will check your code and tell you when your child can start. If you don't have a golden ticket, visit the Parent Portal https://education.durham.gov.uk/parentportal/ where you can check whether you are eligible. If you are eligible you will then receive a letter with your eligibility code. Bring this into the school office, call or email us and your child can get started with their Nursery sessions! Two year olds can take their Nursery place from the start of the term after their second birthday. Application forms are available from school.

We currently have some spaces available for three and four year olds at the start of the week (full days Monday and Tuesday and Wednesday mornings 9.00-12.00) and five afternoons, 12.15-3.15 pm. Every three and four year old is eligible for fifteen hours of free Nursery provision. We take children in straight after their third birthday. Application forms are available from the school office.


