

Class 2 visit to Raby Castle.

Class 2 had a tour of the castle and were able to pretend to use bows and arrows. They learnt about the different rooms in the castle and ate in the servants' quarters.



After lunch they went for a walk around the grounds and saw all the deer and the gardens.







All classes celebrated our love of Science during Science through Stories Week.



Class 1 and Nursery read the book 'The Black Rabbit' and investigated shadows, including:

How are shadows made?
Can you hold your shadow's hand?
Can you change the size of a shadow?







Class 2 read 'George's Marvellous Medicine' and the children created their own marvellous mixtures using different ingredients.



Class 3 used the book 'There was an Old Lady who Swallowed a Fly' through which to base their science work on the digestive system and food chains. It's a very colourful and funny book, which everyone enjoyed.







Class 4 read the picture book 'One Smart Fish' by Chris Wormell and considered how animals have evolved to adapt to their habitats over millions of years. They used the idea of a fish who wanted to move outside of the sea and so grew legs in order to consider the trail of evolution from sea creatures to humans.







Oriental Museum - Start Project

Children from Years 3, 4 and 5 have taken part in the START project this year, funded by Children and the Arts and linked to Durham's Lumiere. The project began in Autumn Term when some pupils visited Lumiere for the preview evening and had a guided tour of the installations at the Botanical Gardens. Workshops were then held in school, looking at sculpture and the theme of birds.







This term all pupils have visited the Oriental Museum. where they looked at artefacts and images relating to the phoenix and created origami birds. The final part of the project was to create a hanging bird to be displayed in the school's grounds as our very own art installation. All the children who have taken part have thoroughly enjoyed the project and have been inspired to develop further installations around the school grounds in the future.

Quadkids

Class 3 attended the Quadkids Festival at Chester-le-Street's Riverside Stadium, to compete against other Durham schools in 4 athletic areas; 100m sprint, howler throw, long jump and 400m run. It was a very hot day, but everyone gave 100% in all four sports!







Class 3 visited the Botanical Gardens to study 'Deserts to Rainforests' as part of their Science and Geography topics. They had a fantastic day in the sunshine looking at plants as food and habitats. They also got to experience the different climates of the desert and the rainforest. Their favourite part of the day was looking at how animals use their habitats to camouflage themselves. They even met some stick insects!







Class 4 have been developing their entrepreneurial skills this term. They took out a £5 loan from Young Enterprise and worked together to decide which products or services they could invest their five pounds in. They created their own businesses, conducting market research in school, budgeting, sourcing resources and materials, advertising and then producing their goods to sell at their enterprise market. The four businesses created were: Chocolate Dippers (who made the most profit), Hair Sweetness, Sugar Rush and Summer Slime Time.





They then used the profit to set up an ice-pop shop in school. Their aim was to make enough to pay for the Year 6 Leavers' meal and they did it!!!

They are very proud to announce that they made an impressive £140 profit at the enterprise market. This includes taking into account the £9 they gave back to Young Enterprise as a legacy contribution!







Congratulations to Mrs McLellan who took part in the European Heart and Lung Transplant Games in Italy! She won an impressive 6 medals: bronze in 400m run and 4k cross country run; silver in 4 x 50m swimming relay and 4 x 100m track relay and gold in 50m breaststroke and 100 m breaststroke! We are all so impressed and extremely proud!



If eligible, you will receive a code which you will need to bring to the office, together with your National Insurance Number and your child's date of birth. We will need to validate your code with Durham County Council before a place can be offered. You will need to complete and sign a parental declaration form to allow this and other checks to be carried out through the new online system. Our School Nursery does take children for the full 30 hours so please make enquiries at the office or with Mrs Lawson, to discuss this. Thank you.
