
Happy Retirement to Mrs Wilkinson!

At the end of the school day children in Class 3 read bedtime stories to children in Class 1 and Nursery whilst children in Class 4 read to children in Class 2.












Where's Wally? Wallys were hidden around school for children to find and win a certificate in the 'Fantastic Where's Wally School Search!'
