## New from September 2017-30 Hours Free Childcare for 3 and 4 year olds

From September 2017, the Government will offer 30 hours of free childcare per week for parents of three and four year olds, to help them continue or take up employment. Guidance from the Department for Education states that you will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible:

- You earn, or expect to earn, the equivalent to 16 hours at National Minimum or Living Wage (as a minimum) for the first three months following application.
- This equates to $£ 120$ a week (or about $£ 6,000$ a year) for each parent over 25 years old or $£ 112.80$ a week (or about $£ 5,800$ a year) for each parent between 21 and 24 years old.
- This applies whether you are in paid employment, self-employed or on zero hours contract.
- Where one parent meets the income criteria above and the other is:
- Unable to work because they are disabled, have caring responsibilities or have been assessed as having limited capability to work.
- On maternity, paternity, shared parental or adoption leave, or if they are on statutory sick leave.
- Where you are in a 'start-up period' (i.e. newly self-employed) you do not need to demonstrate that you meet the income criteria for 12 months.
- If you are a non-European Economic Area (EEA) national, you must have recourse to public funds.


## Who will not qualify?

You will not meet the criteria when:

- Either parent has an income of more than $£ 100,000$.
- Either parent is a non-EEA national and subject to immigration control (and has no recourse to public funds).

## Please keep a note of when your child will need their PE kit in school

Class 1: Monday and Wednesday Class 2: Monday and Thursday<br>Class 3: Monday (PE kit) and Thursday (swimming kit) Class 4: Tuesday and Friday

We recommend children bring their PE kits into school every Monday \& leave them on their pegs for the week, bringing them home every Friday.

## Times Table Challenge

This year we launched our times tables challenge in school. Times tables are an essential part of Maths and are taught relentlessly throughout the school year. Having a good knowledge of times tables and associated facts is the foundation for much of the curriculum. In order to ensure children are reaching the required standard by the end of Year 4 we introduced a focused challenge - The Magic Laurel Forest.
Children will progress through the forest moving from tree to tree when they can recite and answer questions out of sequence on each of the times tables.
The expectations are as set out below:

- Reception: count in multiples of 10,5,2
- Y1 \& Y2: $x 10, x 5, x 2$
- Y3 \& Y4: $x 3, x 4, x 9, x 6, x 7, x 8, x 11, x 12$
- Y5 \& Y6: recap on all of the above and know corresponding division facts and other associated facts such as multiples of 10 and decimals.

We hope you will support your child at home in learning their times tables, so here are a few strategies to help:

- say the multiples forwards and backwards
- look, say, cover, write, check
- chant forwards and backwards e.g. $0 \times 3=0,1 \times 3=3$ etc.
- ask questions out of sequence.

Ask your child where they are in The Magic Laurel Forest and help them practice so that they can get even further!
