




Mrs Taylor

Reception have been having fun in the sun and applying their learning outside with our fabulous new resources and boards!












Dippy Banners

Last week, Mrs Walters and Class 4
trialed Mathletics; a targeted,

learning resource. Children have takehome access to Mathletics, simply
signing in with their school username
and password using any compatible
computer or mobile device.

There are over 1200 activities targeting the maths curriculum.

Each activity **adapts automatically**, evolving as students progress in understanding. Questions are **marked automatically**, with results data sent directly to the teacher. There are **on-screen notifications** for homework and teacher-assigned activities.


Class 1: Monday and Wednesday Class 2: Wednesday and Thursday
