School Fruit Shop

Children in Nursery, Classes 1 and 2 receive a piece of fresh fruit each day for free as part of the Government's fruit scheme.



Children in Classes 3 and 4 can buy a piece of fresh fruit each day for only 50p per week or 10p a day.

Our school is supporting the 'Once a Week, Take a Peek' campaign, which aims to encourage parents/carers to work together to beat head lice.

Head lice are a normal part of childhood with as many as one in ten children experiencing head lice at any time. Although anyone can get head lice, they are particularly common amongst children of primary school age, who spend more time in close contact with their friends. So you need to be vigilant and check your child's hair regularly, ideally once every week. The best known symptom is itching, but not all children will itch at first so don't rely on this.

The good news is that you can deal with head lice quickly and easily. To help you with this we are sending you a copy of the Once a Week, Take a Peek leaflet and a head lice comb with this newsletter. The advice in this leaflet is in line with the latest guidelines on how to deal with head lice.

We will be sending out a half termly text: 'Support the crusade against head lice by remembering to once a week, take a peek!'

We will also send out a text to inform parents/carers if a case of head lice has broken out in your child's class.

We hope that we can all work together to minimise the cases of head lice in school. If you would like any support, please call in to see us and we can put you in touch with the school nurse. Thank you.

YouNow is a fairly new app that allows users over the age of 13 to stream live video and receive comments from viewers.

Broadcasters (the children using the app) are encouraged to become popular and to create content that will attract more viewers. There is also a system for buying a currency to virtually tip broadcasters. Videos created could be copied and stored. Durham Police have been made aware as a result of an ongoing case that children are being encouraged to behave inappropriately, and are then involved in swopping the images generated.
