We'll miss you.












A Day of Welcome was a great success!


Younger children focused their work around The Suitcase by Chris Naylor-Ballesteros which is a touching, timely tale about the importance of kindness and understanding. It was a great book to use to explore the ideas of home, empathy and friendship and was used to encourage children to think about important themes in the story through both discussion questions and the activities they completed.



Children in Years 5 and 6 were very interested in learning about refugees and were shocked about the number of asylum seekers and refugees there are in the world. They enjoyed learning about Nicholas Winston and how he helped the children in WW2.

They focused some of their work around the book Nicky & Vera - A Quiet Hero of the Holocaust and the Children He Rescued. This book is a tribute to one man's courageous efforts to protect Europe's most vulnerable, and a timely portrayal of the hopes and fears of those forced to leave their homes and create new lives.





Thank you so much for your kind donations - we raised £93.65 which will be sent to Refugee Action UK. Everyone looked fabulous in their yellow and blue.

A group of children from Class 3 represented our school at a science fair organised by the Ogden Trust. Several local schools took part, and showed examples of their work. Our group was a credit to the school; they talked about their recent project on space and listened well to information from the other groups. They asked really good questions too.





Class 3 have been working on this project for many weeks now. They worked with scientists and artists on a project called 'Eyes to the Skies'. The children talked to space scientists about galaxies in deep space. They used what they had learnt to inspire amazing artwork, which will be exhibited in an online gallery. We will send details of how to access this gallery when we have them. Eight of our children took work from the project to this Ogden Trust science fair at Durham University, where everyone was very impressed with their knowledge and the amazing artwork.






















Class 2 are well prepared to investigate the school grounds and see which kinds of insects and plants they can find.

If you have a nursery aged child and you would like them to start in our fabulous nursery, you need to come into school to complete our application form and arrange a visit.

This is the only way your child can start their learning journey in our school nursery.

We currently have some spaces available for three and four-year olds. Nursery sessions are start of the week (full days Monday and Tuesday and Wednesday mornings 9.00 – 12.00), end of the week (Wednesday afternoon 12.15 – 3.15, full days Thursday and Friday), five mornings (9.00 – 12.00) and five afternoons (12.15 – 3.15 pm). Some sessions are full. Every three and four-year-old is eligible for fifteen hours of free Nursery provision. We take children in straight after their third birthday. Application forms are available from the school office or our website.



Is your child eligible?



FREE play and learn for 2-year-olds

Your 2-year-old may be entitled to free childcare from the term after their second birthday at 'Play and Learn' sessions –

15 hours a week.

You may be eligible if you meet the criteria on the next page.

You can do a quick and easy check on our parent portal.

You can access this at www.durham.gov.uk/playandlearn or by scanning the QR code below.





If you are eligible, you will be given a code. Please bring this code to the office or call us on 0191 3868416 and we can arrange for your child to start their sessions in our nursery if we have places available.



Is your child eligible?



Your two-year-old can get free play and learn sessions (15 hours) if you receive one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit if you and your partner have a combined income from work of less than £15,400 a year after tax
- Tax credits and you have an annual income of under £16,190 before tax
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Support through part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act
- The Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

Your child will also qualify if they:

- are looked after by the council
- have a current statement of special educational needs or an education, health and care (EHC) plan
- they get Disability Living Allowance
- have left care under a special guardianship order, child arrangements order or adoption order but we will also need some additional evidence, such as a DLA letter. Please contact us for more information.
 - If you're a non-European Economic Area (EEA) citizen who cannot claim benefits Your 2-year-old may get free childcare if you are getting support under the immigration and Asylum Act and have either:
- claimed asylum in the UK and are waiting for a decision (known as 'part 6')
- been refused asylum in the UK (known as 'section 4')

A 2-year-old you care for may also get free childcare if your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax, and you have any of the following:

- leave to remain with 'no recourse to public funds' on family or private life grounds
- support from your local council because you have 'a child in need', for example they have a disability or a child protection plan
- the right to live in the UK because you're the main carer of a British citizen (known as a 'Zambrano Carer)

School Uniform

This is a kind reminder about school uniform in school. Two days each week, children should come to school wearing their PE Kit.

The other three days, they must come to school wearing school uniform.

Our school uniform consists of:

Plain black or plain grey skirt, pinafore, school trousers or school shorts.

Bottle green sweatshirt or cardigan.

White or bottle green polo shirt.

Bottle green/white summer dress.

Dark coloured shoes only.



PE Kit consists of:

School uniform white or dark green polo shirt.

School uniform dark green jumper or cardigan.

Plain black leggings or tracksuit bottoms.

These must be plain black with no coloured decorations or images.

Plain black trainers or appropriate sport shoes with black laces and no coloured decoration or images.

Thank you if you are ensuring that your child is wearing the correct uniform daily.



Thank you to everyone who has signed up to ParentPay so far. From now on, this is how:

- uniform is ordered and paid for;
- consent is given and donations are paid for school visits;
- consent is given for after school clubs;
- payments for dinner money are made.


