
Well done to Class 4!



Every week, class teachers will select a Super Star who has impressed them with all their fabulous work or behaviour at school.



This week Nursery are learning about what firefighters do. We have built a fire engine and squirted water to put out "flames" drawn in chalk.





The theme for British Science Week this year was

Growth.

Nursery's British Science Week was all about how we change as we grow. They had a baby clinic in their role play area and they did some sensory play with baby porridge. They have made a display with their baby photographs and self-portraits to show how they have changed.







Class 1 planted different kinds of seeds... cress, peas, radishes, leafy vegetables, herbs and flowers. They investigated to see which plants grew more quickly and which will take much longer.

They also investigated whether cress grows best in compost, on paper, on cotton wool or on something else. (The answer is compost!) They tried out some very strange things. Do you think cress will grow on half an apple? If anyone can think of another strange place to grow cress why not try it and send in a photograph?












Class 2 talked about how bodies grow as we get older. They measured their hands, plotting the results on a scatter graph to see how hands grow as we get older.








They also learned about Gentoo penguins and how they have had to adapt to climate change whilst building their nests. They built their own nests before pouring water over them to see if they would last during heavy rain.


Class 3 made links to their Read, Write, Inc Literacy work where they have been writing explanations. They took part in a live lesson, watching lambs and calves being born, whilst creating their life cycles. Finally, they tried the 'dream machine - seeing with our brain' task and studied the Jastrow and Ebbinghaus optical illusions. This showed us how our brain uses rules and guesses so that we can understand what our growing bodies sense.

show these qualities.




Children also considered how we see with our brains. They looked at optical illusions and why we appear to see things in a certain way.



We currently have some spaces available for three and four-year olds at the start of the week (full days Monday and Tuesday and Wednesday mornings 9.00 – 12.00), end of the week (Wednesday afternoon 12.15 – 3.15, full days Thursday and Friday), five mornings (9.00 – 12.00) and five afternoons (12.15 – 3.15 pm). Some sessions are nearly full. Every three and four-year-old is eligible for fifteen hours of free Nursery provision. We take children in straight after their third birthday. Application forms are available from the school office or our website.

Your two-year-old can get free play and learn sessions (15 hours) if you get one of the following benefits:

How do you apply?

Bring your golden ticket into our school office and we will tell you when your child can start. If you don't have a golden ticket, visit: https://education.durham.gov.uk/parentportal/where you can check whether you are eligible. If you are eligible you will then receive a letter which you should bring into school. Places will be available at the start of the term after their second birthday.
