

Anti-Bullying Week for 2019 focused on the theme of Change Starts With Us!





We celebrated Odd Socks Day as part of Anti-Bullying Week this year, raising awareness of differences and acceptance.

Nursery and Class 1 explored differences by designing odd socks. Nursery created their designs using the computer and Class 1 made striped patterns. Class 1 also invented pairs of unusual friends.

Class 2 designed odd socks and created a poster about how to be a good friend. They enjoyed creating stories about unlikely friendships e.g. a tiger and a mouse.

Class 3 carried out a maths task looking at positive and negative comments that might be heard during the day. They wrote letters to persuade bullies to change their ways and looked at cyber bullying and how we should all conduct ourselves online.

Class 4 looked at how change needs to start with us and discussed ways in which to make positive changes to behaviours. They each created an explosion book of positivity.



Thank you to parents and carers who came into school to support Anti-Bullying Week this year, working with their children to create a logo for the theme 'Change Starts with us.' Class 4 once again visited Durham University's Physics Department to take part in a space themed day of physics learning activities.

Class 3 have recently completed their fitness review, after a 12-week health and fitness programme with LK Health and Wellbeing.



Class 2 took part in a multi skills festival in school where they completed different sport skills and competed against each other in small groups.










The festival was organised by our Ned Crew who did a fantastic job supporting Class 2 to develop a wide range of skills.
