All children in school have been keeping themselves very active, taking part in many different and exciting activities.





Summer Ollee-day resource pack to help children to have a happy and healthy summer

Holidays offer a great opportunity to spend time together – to talk, to share experiences and, sometimes, feelings. But these conversations are not always easy – especially if your child finds it hard to explore or express their emotions. This is where Ollee comes in.

What is Ollee?

Ollee is a digital friend for children aged 8-11, created by Parent Zone and funded by BBC Children in Need's A Million & Me initiative. This free online service supports children's emotional wellbeing – by helping them reflect on how they feel, process experiences, and find ways to talk about it with a parent or carer.

Ollee offers a safe and supportive digital space with advice on subjects your child may have strong feelings about – including school, family, friends, the internet, and the world. Your child can pick a subject they want to talk about, then choose an emotion they are feeling – and why. For example, 'Something good happened', 'I did something naughty' or 'I feel lonely'. They are then presented with advice about that subject.

If you and your child open an account, you can also find and share advice from Ollee with each other.

Your Summer Ollee-day!

To help you plan a brilliant summer together – and to support family conversations about feelings – they have created a Summer Ollee-day wall chart for you. You can use it together to scribble down all activities your child would like to do.

You can also use the chart to track how your child is feeling and find ways to open up conversations – with Ollee as your helpful virtual assistant!

NSPCC Speak out. Stay safe. programme



Protecting a generation of children against abuse. Find out how we can help your school.

All classes took part in the NSPCC Speak Out. Stay Safe. Programme. Children took part in a virtual assembly and then completed workshops in their classrooms. The programme helps children understand:

- abuse in all its forms and how to recognise signs of abuse
- that abuse is never a child's fault and that they have the right to be safe
- where to get help and the sources of help available to them, including our Childline service.

Trained NSPCC staff delivered the virtual assembly in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot, Buddy the speech bubble.

Buddy wants everyone to know that all children have the right to: speak out and be heard be safe get help when they need it.

Guide to returning to school in September 2021 for parents and carers



Nursery

Nursery children will continue to come into nursery using the same gate you have been using this year.



Morning start:

A member of our nursery staff will open the gate at 8.55 am and the gate will be locked at 9.05 am.

Any arrivals after this time will need to come to the main school entrance to be let in as a late arrival.

Afternoon start:

A member of our nursery staff will open the gate at 12.15 pm and the gate will be locked at 12.25 pm.

Any arrivals after this time will need to come to the main school entrance to be let in as a late arrival.



Collection:

Children will be brought to the gate at 12 noon at the end of morning sessions and 3.15pm at the end of afternoon sessions.

You will be able to come into the garden from September to say goodbye to your child at the Nursery door. A member of staff will be available if you need to pass on any information.

We have found this year that there are so many advantages to children coming straight into Nursery by themselves:

We have a very settled routine in place where children come into Nursery and start their day sitting on the rug straight away, ready to start their session

Starting their sessions at 9.00 am and 12.15 pm maximises all learning opportunities

Children's independence is enhanced by coming into Nursery by themselves and they settle a lot more quickly when they know that they wave to you at the door and get ready to start their day straight away



Please make sure to bring your child on time to Nursery for a 9.00 am or 12.15 pm start every day to help them to start their day in a positive way, knowing what they will be doing. Thank you.

School

All children will return to arriving and being collected at the same time in September. There will be no more staggered starts or collection times.

The main children's entrance gate (the exit gate of the current one-way system) will once again be both the entrance to and exit from school.

Gate will open at 8.50 am.

Gate will be closed at 9.05 am.

Children should enter the gate before 9.00 am and walk straight into school and to their classroom where their teacher will be ready. Lockers will remain in classrooms for children to keep their coat and belongings safe.

Any child arriving into their classroom after 9.10 am will be marked as late.

At home time, all classes will finish at 3.15 pm.

Please assemble on the main school yard to collect your child.

Children in Classes 1 and 2 will be able to leave the classroom when the member of staff at the door sees you on the yard ready to collect your child.

Children in Classes 3, 4T and 4W will be brought to the yard.

Please make sure you stand away from the sides of the building so children can access the yard freely and members of staff can see you clearly. Thank you.

PE

One of the changes to routines due to Covid-19 restrictions that has been very beneficial to all is children arriving to school in PE kits on those days where they have PE. We would like to carry out a trial this year to see if we can incorporate this into our usual practice.

The benefits of coming into school wearing a PE kit are numerous:

- It maximises time spent on physical activity, by cutting out time spent on changing at the start and end of each lesson.
- There has been a significant reduction in items of school uniform and PE kits lost or taken by mistake. This has saved a huge amount of time for you, children and staff looking for missing items.
- It raises the profile of PE in school and helps children to understand the importance of sport in leading an active, healthy lifestyle.
- It evens out wear and tear on uniforms and PE kits, making school uniform last a little longer, and getting maximum wear out of PE kit.

We need the support of all families to make sure that the correct uniform is worn on the correct days so that children always look smart.

PE Kit from September 2021

Two days each week, children will come to school wearing their PE Kit.

The other three days, they must come to school wearing usual school uniform.

PE Kit consists of:

School uniform white or dark green polo shirt

School uniform dark green jumper or cardigan

Plain black leggings or tracksuit bottoms. These must be plain black with no coloured decorations or images.

Plain black trainers or appropriate sport shoe with black laces and no coloured decoration or images.

Class 1: Wednesday and Thursday

Class 2: Monday and Wednesday

Class 3: Tuesday and Friday

Class 4T: Tuesday and Friday

Class 4W: Tuesday and Friday

Uniform
