Nursery children did an amazing job looking after the chicks!














Nursery children have been really interested in learning all about chicks. They have


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They did a fabulous job explaining all their new routines and exciting opportunities and answered lots of questions.








Take some time over half term to practise your times tables! Can you be a Times Table Champion like Harvey who scored 144 out of 144?

Five ways to stay safe in the sun

Help ensure you're well protected from UV rays, by following these tips.

1. Use good quality sunscreen

Buy one that has 'UVA' on the label, a star rating of 4 or 5, is at least SPF 30, water-resistant and still in-date.

Put it on 30 minutes before you go outside and reapply at least every two hours.

2. Wear protective clothing

Wear loose clothes that cover your skin, made from breathable fabrics with a tight weave to stop UV rays getting through. Wear a wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses too.

3. Check the UV index

The UV index tells you how strong the UV rays are in your area. Check it online before you head out.

4.Seek out shade

Avoid sitting in the sun between 11am and 3pm. Seek shade – under some trees perhaps, or bring a parasol out with you.

5. Drink plenty of water

Aim to drink 6-8 glasses of water per day or more if you're feeling thirsty. Steer clear of alcohol as it makes you pee more and can leave you even more dehydrated.

If you have a nursery aged child and you would like them to start in our fabulous nursery, you need to come into school to complete our application form and arrange a visit. **This is the only way your child can start their learning** journey in our school nursery.

If you are interested in any places for two, three or four-year-olds, please call in at the office, call school on 0191 3868416 or e mail laurelavenue@durhamlearning.net to arrange a visit or to check your eligibility code for your two-year-old.

We currently have some spaces available for three and four-year olds. Nursery sessions are start of the week (full days Monday and Tuesday and Wednesday mornings 9.00 – 12.00), end of the week (Wednesday afternoon 12.15 – 3.15, full days Thursday and Friday), five mornings (9.00 – 12.00) and five afternoons (12.15 – 3.15 pm). **Some sessions are full.** Every three and four-yearold is eligible for fifteen hours of free Nursery provision. We take children in straight after their third birthday. Application forms are available from the school office or our website.



FREE play and learn for 2-year-olds

Your 2-year-old may be entitled to free childcare from the term after their second birthday at 'Play and Learn' sessions –

15 hours a week.

You may be eligible if you meet the criteria on the next page.

You can do a quick and easy check on our parent portal.

You can access this at **www.durham.gov.uk/playandlearn** or by scanning the QR code below.





If you are eligible, you will be given a code. Please bring this code to the office or call us on 0191 3868416 and we can arrange for your child to start their sessions in our nursery if we have places available.



Is your child eligible?

Your two-year-old can get free play and learn sessions (15 hours) if you receive one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit if you and your partner have a combined income from work of less than £15,400 a year after tax
- Tax credits and you have an annual income of under £16,190 before tax
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Support through part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act
- The Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

Your child will also qualify if they:

- are looked after by the council
- *have a current statement of special educational needs or an education, health and care (EHC) plan*
- they get Disability Living Allowance
- have left care under a special guardianship order, child arrangements order or adoption order but we will also need some additional evidence, such as a DLA letter. Please contact us for more information.

If you're a non-European Economic Area (EEA) citizen who cannot claim benefits Your 2-year-old may get free childcare if you are getting support under the immigration and Asylum Act and have either:

- claimed asylum in the UK and are waiting for a decision (known as 'part 6')
- been refused asylum in the UK (known as 'section 4')

A 2-year-old you care for may also get free childcare if your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax, and you have any of the following:

- leave to remain with 'no recourse to public funds' on family or private life grounds
- support from your local council because you have 'a child in need', for example they have a disability or a child protection plan
- the right to live in the UK because you're the main carer of a British citizen (known as a 'Zambrano Carer)



for **working parents** of 3 and 4 year olds for up to 30 hours a week

Our School Nursery takes children for the full 30 hours so please make enquiries at the office or with Ms Davison or Mrs Lawson, to discuss this. Thank you.



FUNDED CHILDCARE

Holidays during Term Time The education of all of our children remains the priority in school, and so any absences due to holidays taken during term time will not be authorised.

Please note, if the leave of absence is classed as unauthorised and you still choose to take your child out of school and you have reached 7 days of unauthorised absence in any twelve-week period, information will be passed to the Attendance Improvement Officer and a fixed penalty notice may be issued which carries a fine of \mathbf{E} 60 per child, per parent/carer.

School Uniform

This is a kind reminder about school uniform in school. Two days each week, children should come to school wearing their PE Kit.

The other three days, they must come to school wearing school uniform.

Our school uniform consists of:

Plain black or plain grey skirt, pinafore, school trousers or school shorts.

Bottle green sweatshirt or cardigan. White or bottle green polo shirt. Bottle green/white summer dress. Dark coloured shoes only.



PE Kit consists of:

School uniform white or dark green polo shirt. School uniform dark green jumper or cardigan. Plain black leggings or tracksuit bottoms.

These must be plain black with no coloured decorations or images.

Plain black trainers or appropriate sport shoes with black laces and no coloured decoration or images.

Thank you if you are ensuring that your child is wearing the correct uniform daily.

ParentPay


Thank you to everyone who has signed up to ParentPay so far. From now on, this is how:
